Welcome back! It is great to be starting another wonderful year of learning and praying together at St. Paul Catholic School.

We have great news! As you know, we use *Everyday Mathematics* as the core mathematics curriculum for our school. Over the summer, we purchased the newest edition of this program. One of the main benefits we saw for purchasing the third edition of *Everyday Mathematics* was a new on-line website for students and parents. The website includes an on-line Student Reference Book for grades 1-6. In addition, it has tutorials to teach students and parents how to solve problems and games for students to play to reinforce math skills. We thought our parents and students would love the new component! Therefore, we purchased it and all teachers have been trained to use it. Now it's your turn to learn!

First, the on-line website can be utilized on any computer that has internet access. This letter will explain the procedure for accessing the website and the programs that are available. If you have any questions about the website or the programs, feel free to contact your child's teacher. Parents will also receive a brief demonstration at the September 10 Parent Orientation.

Next, if you do not have home internet access, or if you develop computer problems, please contact your child's teacher to borrow a hard cover Student Reference Book. Also, Mrs. Holland uses her after-school planning on Mondays, until 3:30, to allow students to work in our computer lab.

Lastly, don't lose the attached student LOG-IN information. You and your child will need this to access the website. Your directions are attached. Please know that each teacher is committed to teaching the children how to access this new website as well.

Accessing Everyday Math Online at Home

1) In a web browser such as Microsoft's Internet Explorer or Apple's Safari, go to the **Everyday Math Online** home page at <https://www.everydaymathonline.com>.

If this is your first visit, click the **support** link in the upper right corner of the page. A new page will open displaying the **Technology Requirements**. Review the requirements, and click **Run Test** to make sure your computer is ready to run **Everyday Math Online**.
NOTE: You must allow pop-ups from everydaymathonline.com to use the site.

2) Click the button in the upper left corner of the page.

3) On the **STUDENT LOGIN** page, fill in your child's user name exactly as shown on the Student Login Card, attached to this letter, then click **START**.

4) Enter the three digit password that is shown on the Student Login card containing your child's user name.

5) Finally, click **Log in**. The programs that your child has access to will appear on the next screen. Click **Launch** to access the program you want to use.
